

ALWAYS ON BOARD


- ENGAGED

VALUE CLOSE RELATIONSHIP WITH TEACHERS


- THEY THRIVE WHEN THE TEACHER NOTICES THEM

PHILOSOPHERS AND CRITICS


- HIGH LEVELS OF COGNITIVE ENGAGEMENT

- OFTEN MISUNDERSTOOD




They want


