SMALL MISTAKES ...! (cont.)

- Regular control of statements
- Temptation to work around the budget
- Inaccurate stats have influence on next budget



FRAUD:

The intention to commit an illegal or irregular act or to attain a goal which is not in harmony with law or policy.



FRAUD: (cont.)

- Maladministration or financial misconduct in handling or reporting money
- Irregular behaviour in allocation of funds
- Manipulative conduct in awarding contracts
- Invoicing for work not done

FRAUD: (cont.)

- Theft of funds
- Personal use of assets
- Abuse of internet services of the school
- Deliberately refusing to report or act upon dishonest or suspicious conduct
- Non completion of leave forms and non submission of leave forms

(Basic financial systems for schools, WCED)



CORRUPTION:

Directly or indirectly accepts or gives any gratification from or to any other person, whether for the benefit for him/herself or for the benefit of another person in an illegal, dishonest or unauthorised manner.



CORRUPTION: (cont.)

- Performing favours for friends or relatives
- Avoiding compliance with protocols
- Kickbacks, e.g. Cash
- Employment offers for family or friends
- Funding of personal expenses
- Gifts of any kind, special treatment or favours
- Tampering of documents
